



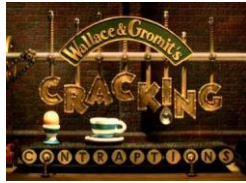
UKS2 Summer term overview

Our learning

Year 5 and 6 continues to be an exciting and busy phase! We try very hard to create lots of links between all of our learning and this term all our work is around **Leisure and Entertainment**. This will cover all sorts of fun and frolics throughout the term including School Journey for year 6, our 2 weeks swimming, a visit to the World Para Athletics Championships, fair grounds and creating our own games as part of a science project on forces.



In Literacy we have started our new texts. Year 6 will be starting with *The Boy Who Swam with Piranhas* whilst year 5 gets involved with some of *Wallace and Gromit's Cracking Contraptions*.



This term is also very important for year 6 who will be completing their SATs (week beginning 8th May), heading off on School Journey and beginning to think about their end of year show. - Talk to your child about their day
- Visit free museums and libraries - our school library is open after school on Tuesdays.
